

## Casco Bay Canisters

### Supplies:

1. Pattern: Casco Bay Canisters by Aunties Two
2. Fabric: 1 jelly roll or 40 – 2 ½” strips, Binding – 1 yd, Tops and Base – 1 yd
3. 155 feet cotton clothesline (we will have this available in the shop)
4. Fusible batting or fleece – 1 yd (I used fusible fleece)
5. Stiff interfacing (Craf-tex #337) – 1 yd
6. Fusible web (Lite Steam-a-Seam II) – 2 yds
7. Cotton thread – 50- weight is preferred (several spools of coordinating color)
8. Upholstery thread (12 wt) in a neutral color that blends well with your fabric.
9. Buttons (4)
10. Simplicity 1 ¼” bias tape maker (optional but very useful)
11. Fabric pencils or chalk
12. Sewing machine needles: Microtex 90/14
13. Sewing machine with accessories ( ¼” foot especially) and manual
14. Rotary equipment
15. Basic sewing supplies (thread, scissors-paper and fabric, pins, etc)
16. Freezer paper
17. OGGI Stack ‘n Store Acrylic canisters (these are available from Amazon or Target)

### Pre-class Preparation:

1. Cut 2 – 30” X 20” rectangles of fabric and 2 of fusible batting.
2. Cut 1 – 30” X 20” rectangle of stiff interfacing (fuse the fusible web to both sides. Leave the paper on the piece).
3. If you have time, go ahead and fuse the five layers together as listed on page 1. If you are not comfortable doing this, we can do it in class.
4. We will be cutting all circles in class.
5. Press the strips so that it looks like single fold bias tape (if you have questions about this just ask). Use the Simplicity 1 ¼” bias tape maker to make the pressing easier and faster.
