**Serged Satchel Supply List**

- **Serger, manual, power cord, foot control, accessories, etc. Four cones of regular neutral color serger thread (this is for gathering the strips and construction of the bag).**
- **Regular serger presser foot, and gathering foot or attachment if you own one**
- **Extra fabric for test stitching and adjusting the gathering stitch**
- **Serged Satchel pattern, Indygo Junction, Pattern IJ826 (will be available at the shop)**
- **Twelve fabric strips 2 ½-inch wide by 44” inches long (You may use jelly rolls or Bali pops if you wish)**
- **½-yard fabric for the purse base**
- **1 ½ yards of fabric for purse lining, bias tape trim, handles and ties**
- **½ yard lightweight cotton batting or fusible fleece for backing of purse base**
- **¼ yard fusible fleece for handles**
- **Contrasting serger thread for the edge finish on the ruffles We will be using a three thread overlock and you may use decorative thread in the loopers: Jeans thread, Pearl rayon, Décor or regular weight serger thread. You will need a serger thread for the needle in a matching color**
- **General sewing supplies: fabric markers, ruler, seam ripper, snips, scissors, double eyed needle, straight pins, etc.**
- **There are two styles of handles on the pattern. One requires four metal or plastic rings. Indygo Junction used “Purse-n-alize it Tortoise Plastic Rings” from JoAnn’s Fabrics. The second handle option is made with trim fabric.**
- **1” wide bias tape maker (optional) The instructor has one.**
- **Tube turner (optional)**

**We will be using a sewing machine to attach the ruffles to the purse base and for the bias binding, etc. If you want to bring your own, you may. We will have two in the classroom. You may also finish the sewing at home if you wish.**

**You could also use the two thread chain stitch on your serger, but it would require a lot of rethreading.**
